## Spring Wildflower Walk

As part of our <u>Ribbons of Remnant Roadsides</u> Project (RRR) UGLN ran another spring wildflower walk along Clarks Road in Yea and we were treated to a brilliant display of wildflowers and orchids. The walk was led by renowned botanist Geordie Scott-Walker and attendees got to see and learn about the wildflowers and rare flora found in this significant area of roadside vegetation.

Highlights included the Green-comb Spider-orchid, Twining Fringe-lily, Blunt and Dwarf Greenhood Orchids, Musky Caladenia Orchid and Golden Moth Orchid. Masses of Sun-orchids, Milkmaids, Chocolate and Bulbine Lilies were also starting to appear.

#### UGLN Junior Landcare.



Congratulations to two of our local schools that were successful with their 2022 Victorian Junior Landcare and Biodiversity Grant applications.

Kinglake West PS received \$2300 for their Indigenous Sensory Garden-Sustainability Committee Project.

Members of the Kinglake Landcare Group recently attended the school to give advice to the students about what plants would be suitable for their sensory garden. The students and landcarers planted some of the critically endangered Round-leaf Pomaderris and other local species in the school garden.

Kinglake West PS is also now officially registered as a Junior Landcare Group.

Kinglake Primary School also received a \$1250 Junior Landcare Grant towards their Indigenous Garden.

Students from Mt Lilydale Mercy College kindly built 15 nesting boxes for us to use in our Landcare projects to provide important artificial homes for wildlife including sugar gliders, ringtail possums and brush-tailed phascogales.

The boxes will be installed by local landcarers on farms and properties across the Upper Goulburn.

#### Mt Pleasant Reserve - Nest Boxes



Landcarers from Home Creek-Spring Creek and UT Creek Landcare Groups joined Joanne and Alana from <u>Ecology and Restoration Australia</u> to inspect the nesting boxes at Mt Pleasant Reserve in Alexandra.

The project has been funded by <u>Parks Victoria's</u> <u>Volunteering Innovation Fund</u>, and they are monitoring 500 nest boxes across Victoria to assess use by native and introduced species, and any maintenance issues.

They made a great start in Alexandra, checking 30 boxes, and identified a few maintenance issues that they'll be working with Parks Victoria to get fixed. Inhabitants included Brush-tailed Possums, Ringtail Possums and quite a few sugar glider families - like those in the picture.





# Pheasant Creek Blackberry Action Group



The Pheasant Creek Blackberry Action Group (PCBAG) is working together with landowners in the Kinglake Ranges to reduce the impact of blackberries in the region, with practical on ground solutions, education and community engagement.

Blackberry is an invasive shrub and is a threat to agriculture and the natural environment in Victoria due to its rapid growth and spread. It also helps facilitate the spread of Queensland Fruit Fly. Targeted Blackberry control efforts in this area, will benefit the many commercial fruit growers in the region, the agriculture industry more broadly and the environment.

The PCBAG Project Officer is now conducting free assessments for landowners to map and assess the extent of blackberry infestations on their property.

With the assistance of our project officer landowners will then have the option of developing a management plan that will assist them to plan the control and management of blackberry infestations on their property.

Our project officer can also provide technical advice and information on the control of blackberries and other assistance such as chemical rebates and Landcare incentives.
